

Artist Copyrights

The following information is from the U.S. Copyright Office <http://copyright.gov/help/faq/index.html> and Copyright Basics (excerpts from an online book on published the U.S. Copyright Office.)

What is copyright?

Copyright is a form of protection grounded in the U.S. Constitution and granted by law for original works of authorship fixed in a tangible medium of expression. Copyright covers both published and unpublished works.

What does copyright protect?

Copyright, a form of intellectual property law, protects original works of authorship including literary, dramatic, musical, and artistic works, such as poetry, novels, movies, songs, computer software, and architecture.

Copyright has two main purposes: protection of the creator's right to obtain commercial benefit from the work, and protection of the creator's general right to control how a work is used.

When is my work protected?

Your work is under copyright protection the moment it is created and fixed in a tangible form that it is perceptible either directly or with the aid of a machine or device.

Do I have to register with your office to be protected?

No. In general, registration is voluntary. Copyright exists from the moment the work is created. You will have to register, however, if you wish to bring a lawsuit for infringement of a U.S. work.

As of 1989, works created privately and originally are copyrighted and protected whether it has a notice or not. Copyright protection exists from the moment the work is created. The only person who is allowed to copy the work is the person who created it. One does not need to use the copyright symbol or register a copyright for it to exist; however, using it reminds others not to copy the work.

Also, using a copyright notice and registering a copyright strengthens the protection and subsequent damages that may be awarded.

The correct form for a notice is:

"Copyright [date] by [author/owner]"

© is acceptable also. Adding "All rights reserved" is sometimes added especially in books.

Example: © 2011 Jane Doe

Note that the date is not required on some items.

"The year date may be omitted where a pictorial, graphic, or sculptural work, with accompanying textual matter, if any, is reproduced in or on greeting cards, postcards, stationery, jewelry, dolls, toys, or any useful article..."

U.S. Copyright law is quite explicit that the making of what are called "derivative works" -- works based or derived from another copyrighted work -- is the exclusive province of the owner of the original work. In other words, works created that are similar to someone else's work is an infringement. There is no "30% rule". The test is done by placing the original work next to the work in question. If an impartial group of people look at the later work and determine that it appears to have been copied from the original work, the latter work is considered an infringement.

Duration of copyright: Your family or legal heirs will still own the copyright to your artwork until 70 years after your death.

Capturing the Personality of People and Pets in Watercolor by Suzanna Winton
October 12-15, 2015 at Suniland Park

What did you learn at Suzanna's workshop?



I had a lot of fun meeting everybody and learning new techniques to tackle various portraiture subjects, which has always been a tough


subject area for me to paint. Suzanna's style of glazing and building layers of warm and cool color washes to create the final color was new for me. I typically mix the final color I want and only use glazes and washes to intensify color, unify a painting or darken areas I want to recede.

This was also my first time using Arches 300 lb Hot Press, a very different paper than my usual Arches 140 lb Rough or Cold Press. The paper could handle a lot more water without buckling, and many, many glazes! It also gave me much more time when I used any wet into wet techniques, as it dries out much slower than a 140 lb paper.

After taking the class, I see a lot of pet paintings for Christmas gifts this year. – **John Keepax**, new MWS member

The portrait workshop was challenging. Everyone worked hard and enjoyed the relaxed and encouraging atmosphere. We traced and then painted a dog, cat and a person.

On the third day everyone painted an eye, nose, mouth and a chart of different painting techniques and skin colors. Everyone gained in skill and confidence in their ability to paint portraits. – **Jan De Jong**
